Our campus is a vibrant and diverse community, comprising 2647 students, 156 staff. It spans 82800 m² of beautiful grounds that include state-of-the-art facilities, green spaces, and modern infrastructure.

The total number of beneficiaries from these projects is approximately 6,400 individuals, with a total budget of around \$1,400,000 USD.

8. Academic and Research Initiatives

At PAU, our commitment to sustainability goes beyond campus operations; it's deeply embedded in our academic and research endeavors. We recognize the power of education and innovation in addressing global challenges and nurturing future leaders.

8.1 Sustainability in Academics

8.1.1 Curriculum Integration:

Sustainability principles are woven into our academic programs. Last year, we introduced 234 new courses that directly address sustainability topics, ranging from environmental sciences to social justice.

8.1.2 Interdisciplinary Programs:

We've launched interdisciplinary sustainability programs, encouraging students to explore the interconnected nature of sustainability challenges. Our Electrical engineering- renewable energy saw a 20% increase in enrollment. The following programs are also considered:

Global Scholars for Achieving Career Success (GSACS) Project

The project connects students from five colleges at the City University of New York (CUNY) with students from universities in Palestine (represented by Palestine Ahliya University), Jordan, Egypt, and Morocco. Students participate in collaborative educational modules lasting 6 to 10 weeks each semester. They work together on research and joint interventions in globally relevant issues of common interest, viewed through the lens of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Particular focus is on SDG 6, "Sustainable Water Management," and SDG 10, "Reduced Inequality."

Overview of Program Benefits for Students:

Preparing students to become researchers taking action on urgent global issues.

Equipping students with job readiness skills needed for success in a world dominated by mobile platforms such as Zoom and Google Drive.

Simultaneously and asynchronously collaborating with students from the City University of New York and the Middle East and North Africa region.

Exploring a global issue related to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals through dialogue with peers, professors, and industry experts from the United States, the Middle East, and North Africa.

Engaging in project-based experiential learning that studies the causes and effects of this issue in their communities, develops solutions at local, national, and global levels.

Presenting their work at a student-led virtual conference.

Participating in career development workshops.

This program's impact also extends to teachers and participating universities, contributing to:


Peer learning, sharing experiences, and best practices.

Fostering a global outlook and promoting collaboration among prestigious colleges and universities from different countries and cultures.

Increasing awareness and engagement with globally relevant issues, particularly related to sustainability, green energy, and social justice and inequality.

Localizing knowledge and practice through virtual exchange for learning and education on a global basis.

The program was implemented between 2020 and 2023, resulting in 21 virtual exchanges at Palestine Ahliya University, benefiting 18 teachers and approximately 950 students.



Community Engagement and Service-Learning

U-SOLVE Sustainable Urban Development Solutions to Promote Entrepreneurship Project

The project is funded by ENICBMED within the framework of the European Union, focusing on Mediterranean countries. The project's budget is 3.5 million USD, with a 10% contribution from the partners. The project is implemented in six Mediterranean countries, including Palestine, Jordan, Egypt, Italy, Greece, and Cyprus. In Palestine, the project is led by Palestine Ahliya University, with Bethlehem Municipality as a key partner.

The project's objective is to enhance and support young entrepreneurs in urban areas, with a specific focus on environmental and sustainable development. It aligns with strategies for startups to make them suitable for Mediterranean countries. Additionally, the project directs entrepreneurial energy towards sustainable and integrated development.

Palestine Ahliya University's role in the U-SOLVE project includes leadership and responsibility for work package "2" related to project communication and media productions. Like all partners, the university implements the project through community engagement, aiding in creating and enhancing local ecosystems, supporting young entrepreneurs, and promoting entrepreneurial projects in Palestinian urban areas. The project also aims to strengthen the application of new approaches in urban development strategies.

Key Outputs of the Project:

Development of roadmaps and methodologies to enhance urban entrepreneurship incubation systems in each partner country.

Implementation of training to enhance innovative ideas and startup companies.

Technical and financial support for 30 entrepreneurial projects (5 in each partner country).

Establishment of business development centers - one in each partner country. Palestine Ahliya University's business development center will serve as a key reference for engaging key stakeholders, coordinating work methodologies, and influencing policies and related actions. This will enhance the coherence of the entrepreneurship and sustainable development incubation ecosystem and urban development, fostering collaboration and coordination among its components.

Development of an urban entrepreneurship strategy/policy linked to sustainable development in the Mediterranean region.



Community Projects:

We actively engage with the local community through service-learning and community projects. These projects address local sustainability issues, such as food security, energy access, and environmental restoration.

Student Initiatives:

Our students are proactive in leading sustainability initiatives within the community. They have initiated projects such as urban gardens, sustainability workshops, and recycling programs in collaboration with local partners.

Positive Youth Engagement (PYE) Program

The PYE program aims to support 50,000 young individuals in Palestine through a range of activities, participation opportunities, leadership development, and resources to pursue peaceful and productive futures. By enhancing the community participation of young people and activating their societal roles through various interventions related to life skills, career and academic guidance, designing community initiatives, and related psychosocial support, the program collaborates directly with Palestinian youth.

The program's goal is to reintegrate young people aged 15-24 into social and economic life by empowering them to successfully achieve their goals and building the capacities of young individuals aged 10-14 to prevent their isolation and separation from social and economic opportunities.

The Community Development and Continuous Education Association (CDCE-I), in partnership with Palestine Ahliya University, is responsible for implementing this program in Bethlehem Governorate. The program also includes a pilot initiative to host and establish the first group of Digital Mapping Students called "YOUTHMAPPERS" in Palestine. Through this initiative, knowledge will be transferred to several other Palestinian universities.

PYE strives to foster positive engagement among young Palestinians, offering them essential skills and support to build a better future within their communities and the wider society.





Community Hackathon Project:

The project aims to contribute to strengthening the role of grassroots youth groups, represented by Community Accountability Committees, Local Youth Councils, and other youth groups in decision-making processes at the local level in the southern West Bank. This is achieved by enhancing active participation in public issues, especially those of social and economic significance.

Project Outputs:

Implementation of two capacity-building programs (individual and institutional) for grassroots groups.

188 members of grassroots groups benefited from capacity-building programs.

Implementation of 14 community needs assessments in 14 locations using 56 tools within the Participatory Rapid Appraisal methodology.

Implementation of 10 community initiatives that contribute to reducing barriers to social inclusion and gender equality.

42 activities carried out in 10 communities as part of the community initiatives, including community accountability activities, equipping educational community centers, installing benches along roads, and signing a community honor pledge.

Direct and indirect beneficiaries: 4,200 individuals benefited from community initiative activities. Release of seven videos as part of the project.

The Community Hackathon Project empowers grassroots youth groups to become active participants in their communities, addressing social and economic challenges and fostering inclusive, equitable, and accountable local decision-making processes.



Promoting Active Citizenry Through Local Development Leadership (P-Active):

The project aims to address urgent issues in Palestinian communities, empowering Palestinian citizens and civil society actors to hold public institutions accountable and enhance social and political progress, improve living conditions, and promote prosperity.

Project Objectives: The "Promoting Active Citizenry Through Local Development Leadership" project seeks to empower and enhance youth participation and representation in public spheres, reinforce transparency and accountability, and improve governance and the capacities of project partners. The project uses a two-pronged approach, focusing on local needs and grassroots empowerment.

The project addresses several vital and pressing issues related to Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) within local communities, including:

Human rights and the rule of law; related SDGs: (10) Reduced Inequality and (16) Strong Institutions for Peace and Justice.

Environment and climate change; related SDGs: (6) Clean Water and Sanitation and (13) Climate Action.

Empowerment and social and economic inclusion of women and youth; related SDGs: (8) Decent Work and Economic Growth and (17) Partnerships for the Goals.

Project Outputs:

Support and empowerment of human and institutional capacities of project partners.

Holding knowledge transfer and experience-sharing sessions between project partners and grassroots groups.

Developing key project themes in strategic, programmatic, and operational frameworks, including policies/procedures for project partners and grassroots groups.

Implementation of capacity-building programs for project partners and grassroots groups covering active citizenship, community mapping, design and implementation of community initiatives, rapid assessment, localization of Sustainable Development Goals, and human rights-based design thinking.

Implementation of nine initiatives at various levels: three grassroots-based solutions, three national-level solutions, and three advocacy initiatives.



Future Goals

Expanded Sustainability Programs: We aim to continue expanding our sustainability course offerings, ensuring that sustainability is an integral part of every student's academic journey. Research Impact: We are committed to increasing our research impact by fostering more collaborations with external partners and launching interdisciplinary research initiatives. Community Engagement: We aspire to deepen our community engagement through more sustainability projects that address local needs and create a lasting positive impact. PAU remains dedicated to fostering a culture of sustainability through education and research, equipping our students and faculty with the knowledge and tools to drive positive change in the world.

9. Campus Sustainability Initiatives

At PAU, our campus is a living laboratory for sustainability. We are committed to creating a physical environment that aligns with our values and serves as a model for sustainable practices.

9.1 Sustainable Design:

Our buildings are designed with sustainability in mind. Features such as energy-efficient lighting, passive heating and cooling, and the use of sustainable building materials are integral to our construction and renovation projects.





9.2 Transportation Initiatives

9.2.1 Bike Infrastructure:

Now we will expand our bike infrastructure with dedicated bike lanes and secure bike storage facilities. We actively promote cycling as a sustainable and healthy mode of transportation, this will be considered in future plan.

9.2.2 Electric Vehicle Charging:

We've installed 2 electric vehicle (EV) charging stations on campus, encouraging the use of EVs and reducing greenhouse gas emissions.








9.3 Energy Efficiency Measures

10.1 Students

10.1.1 Student Organizations:
